Suspicious Activity

We received this message from the Minneapolis Police Department. Please keep an eye out for suspicious people in the neighborhood!

When you see a suspicious person in the neighborhood please Call 911.

A suspicious person does include door to door sales people that do not have the proper City of Minneapolis identification

- On **8/17/16** a 311 one call was placed for a suspicious person trying to raise money for tennis shoes on Bedford Street SE
- On 8/23/16 there was a 311 call placed and an email post on the "ppelist" about a suspicious person going door to door trying to sell magazines on Malcolm Avenue SE
- On **8/23/16** there was a burglary on the 100 block of Melbourne Avenue SE

At this time we CANNOT link the suspicious person(s) to the burglary. Be aware that burglars often will scout out an area to see if people are home.

The 2nd Precinct usually receives the 311 reports within 24 hours of being posted and by that time the incident has past. When you call 911 as you are witnessing the suspicious activity a squad can be dispatched and hopefully we can identify the individual.

PPA, together with the PPe-list, is working to create a neighborhood message forum on edemocracy.org. The e-democracy format is used by several neighborhood groups across the Twin Cities to spread the word on events, news and concerns. It is also a great way to have opinionated discourse on various topics pertaining to local events. If you would like to sign up for the e-democracy forum please email <u>Jessica</u>. Please see the note below from Lois Willand, the creator of the Prospect Park e-list:

We want you to know that we fully support the new Prospect Park e-democracy list being established. In fact, we asked for it!

Don't worry about the current ppelist--we will continue to publish it, with some changes, explained below.

Why two lists, you ask? Mostly to separate out the various functions currently handled by the ppelist. Over the years, the content of the ppelist has gone from its original plan of being a simple, friendly neighborhood bulletin board to include notices from city and county agencies, official surveys, etc.

Some of you have said the list is no longer the same, that it's lost its neighborhood "feel", or that you're getting too many messages. Some of you want to use the list for spirited discussions of political and community issues. We list keepers have tried to steer a middle path, but it has become clear that the communication needs of Prospect Park are more than we three volunteers can manage. So, we'll continue to publish your individual notices about yard sales, rentals and roommates wanted, lost pets, and notices about events taking place in Prospect Park, just as before. For notices from government agencies and entities outside of Prospect Park, you can access those at the e-democracy site. Note: there will probably be some duplicating messages between our two lists, as we work out the system.

It's Fall - launching new and old programs for Southeast Seniors

Southeast Seniors is launching some new programs this fall with a focus on connecting to University of Minnesota students. They live nearby, let's get to know them. Anyone 65 and older who lives in the 55414 area is eligible for Southeast Senior programs. Go to the <u>SE Seniors website</u> or call us at <u>612-331-2302</u> for more information about or get involved with the following programs:

- 1. Join the <u>Connection Club</u> and befriend a student from the University. This is an opportunity to connect with a University of Minnesota student over the course of the semester. Meet with them at your convenience get help with fall yard clean up, organizing your garage, making a meal, or talking/playing a game over a cuppa. For more information,
- 2. Enlist a team of students from the nutrition program to spend some time with you (or you and a friend) to kick start your time in the kitchen by talking about nutrition and cooking together. Get involved with the short term program <u>Healthy Cooking for Seniors</u>.
- 3. Fall raking need assistance to get your yard raked once the leaves fall. Let us know and we'll add you to the list. Timing will most likely be the end of October.
- 4. Marcy School Intergenerational Program connects seniors living in Holmes Park Village (near Marcy) and middle school students. Last year they made over 40 fleece blankets. If you have fleece you can donate, we would be most grateful. Anywhere between 1.5 and 2.5 yards are needed per blanket.

Intentional Communities Forum

An ordinance has been proposed for a new kind of rental registration in Minneapolis. The intentional community ordinance would provide flexibility for a greater number of unrelated adults to live in a dwelling, provided that they meet the test of an intentional community and maintain an appropriate rental registration.

Join Second Ward City Council Member **Cam Gordon**, Minneapolis Director of Regulatory Services **Mike Rumppe**, and University District neighbors for a presentation and discussion on the proposed ordinance and what it could mean for residents and neighborhoods.
